

Summary: With minimum intervention there is opportunity for the Dog Kennel Hill Open Space to be enhanced to improve its access and facilities for users, as well as its value for nature and biodiversity.

site survey



the wire fence reduces the enclosed aspect of the site and does not contribute to a natural biodiverse landscape.

furniture such as bins and benches are badly positioned for spacial legibility



the access from the estate towards sainsbury's is poorly positioned, confusing and appears to be blocked at the other end.



the natural area can be improved by removing old gates and posts, by enhancing existing planting with native species and by creating a simple and well intergrated viewing area



both seating areas are very square and with unnatural planting



the access to the rear of sainsbury's should be improved and made safer



the sainsbury's entrance is confusing with too much furniture obstructing access and a lack of clear direction
